In our continuous efforts to set the standard for excellence in co-operative retailing, Twin Valley Co-op is pleased to offer a variety of credit options to approved members. The **FCC Lead with Seed** season ended June 30th. All Seed invoices were transferred to FCC on or before June 30th. With this program, producers were able to take advantage of Interest Free and No Payments until Oct 1/21. If you currently do not participate in this program and are interested, please speak with your Agro Representative or Audrey. Applications for the Program for next season will begin in September 2021.

The **FCC Crop Input** term ends Aug 31, 2021. All invoices up to and including August will be transferred on or before Aug 31st. A new term begins Sept 1, 2021 to Aug 31, 2022. The balance of FCC inputs from Sept 1, 2020 to Aug 31, 2021 will be due March 15th, 2022.

Scotiabank Yield More Financing have the same terms except for due date. Their due date is February 23rd, 2022. For both FCC and Sociabank, if you require an increase to your limit please speak with your Ag Representative or give Audrey a call.

Russell Gas Bar Cardlock

Members: as many of you are aware, a new Twin Valley Co-op Cardlock was built at the Co-op Bulk Petroleum Plant south of Russell, and it opened this spring.

The reason for this, was due to the difficulties we have experienced at the Russell Gas Bar cardlock. We have found that in some cases, parts for are no longer available when repairs are needed. The pump islands are breaking apart, and the parking lot needs constant maintenance. We are also concerned about safety.

The old Russell Gas Bar cardlock will be decommissioned by mid-August, and all equipment will be removed from the site.

The new cardlock is much bigger and allows for easier access, and also has plenty of room for parking if needed. Your current cardlock card will work at this new location; there is no need to



get a new one. The same product you purchased at the old site is available at this one.

If you haven't tried the new cardlock yet, please do. The new site is a great upgrade.
