Twin Valley Co-op Celebrates 90th Anniversary in 2019

Twin Valley Co-op has deep roots in the communities we serve, 90 years deep. And through the years we have proven our commitment to our members by making the communities' priorities our priorities. We donate regularly to a wide range of organizations, feature local products prominently, volunteer, and most importantly – give back to our members through Co-op Equity. Twin Valley Co-op is celebrating its 90th Anniversary in 2019. We have been celebrating this year through a variety of events: In January, providing members with baby onesies to new babies born in 2019; in February the food stores sold bread for 29 cents a loaf on Feb 6th. On March 29th, we had a contest to win your fuel purchase back at 1929 prices (just 5¢ per litre). On April 15th, our 90th anniversary of the date of incorporation, we held a social media contest to win a \$90 gift card. In May, we celebrated with a video visit with Bob Blelloch, former 30+year employee of Twin Valley Co-op (Birtle Lumber), who just celebrated his 102nd birthday. Bob was able to describe many of the changes he saw in his years of serving the community while being employed by the Co-op.

Twin Valley Co-op continues its anniversary celebrations by hosting Fundraising Community BBQs in Birtle, Elkhorn, Miniota, Rossburn and Russell. On June 7th, \$635 was raised for the community of Elkhorn with a donation going to the Elkhorn Elks. On June 20th, \$871.20 was raised for the Birtle Curling Club. The BBQ events are planned to raise funds and 100% of the proceeds will stay in the host community. The Cooper mascot is on hand for the children handing out balloons, door prizes, a radio station will be on site, and of course 90th Anniversary Cake! Twin Valley Co-op is also pleased to unveil its new community benches at the BBQ. Moulson's Welding of Foxwarren and Art Farm of Russell created five community benches that will be installed in each community for people to know that "You're at home here" with Co-op.

Aug 30/19 is the end of the FCC term. Balances from Sept 1/18 to Aug 30/19 will be due by Mar 15/2020. Purchases from Sept 1/19 to Aug 31/2020 are not due until Mar 15/2021. If you would like to know more about the FCC program please speak to anyone of our staff in the Agro departments or myself.

The 2019 growing season has started off as a very busy one. Our Ag teams have been working together with growers to manage the many challenges that have been presented.

The Twin Valley agronomists have put countless hours in scouting for frost damage, flea beetle, cutworm populations, and drought stress. The level of expertise available to members through our team of agronomists is second to none, and the value of sound agronomic advice has become especially evident in this spring.

One of the great things about being locally owned and operated is that we have the ability to work with our customers one on one to meet their individual agronomic, economic, equipment, and building needs. I would encourage you to spend time with your local branch to

New to Twin Valley Co-op is the addition of a bin crane which allows us to build Galvanized Bins up to 24' in diameter. 
